Examples from biblical texts will include Mary's call and response in prophetic speech (Luke 1:26-56), an understanding of the cross that rejects abuse and injustice and opens the way toward self-surrender in love (Mark 8:34; John 19:34), and a widow whose persistent demand for justice offers a female image of God (Luke 18:1-8).
